Some schools were in the early stages of developing STEM programs, while others had classrooms that consisted of math and science integration, as well as technology being fully integrated into a STEM program. The group further discussed recommending that these schools pair up with schools that are not fully developed with their STEM programs in order to assist them with making their STEM education programs more effective.

It was discussed that it would be beneficial to all schools to have access to the reviewer's scoring rubric ahead of the school visits, so they can tailor the reviewers experience in presenting the best possible experience for future site visits.
