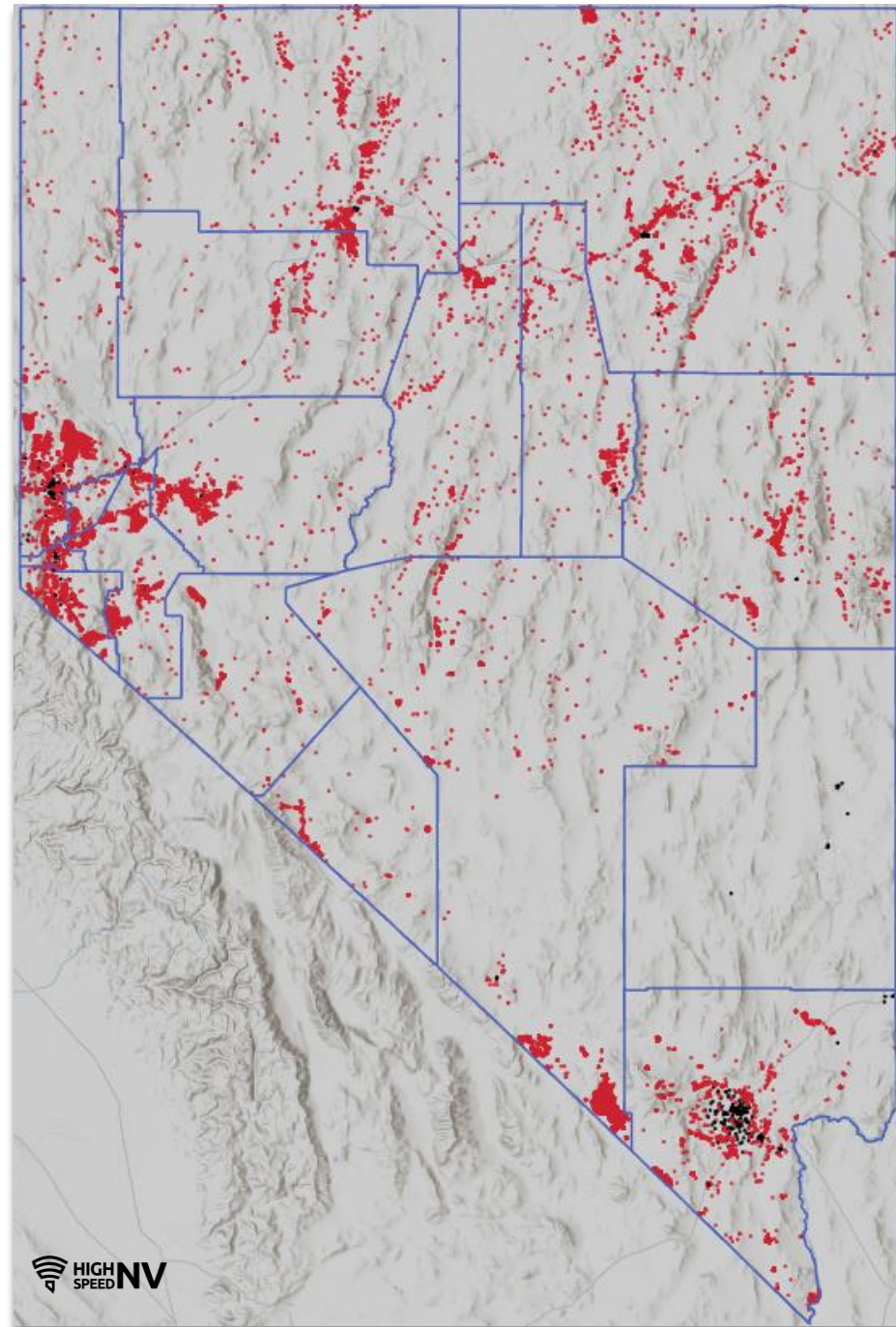
# BROADBAND VISION:

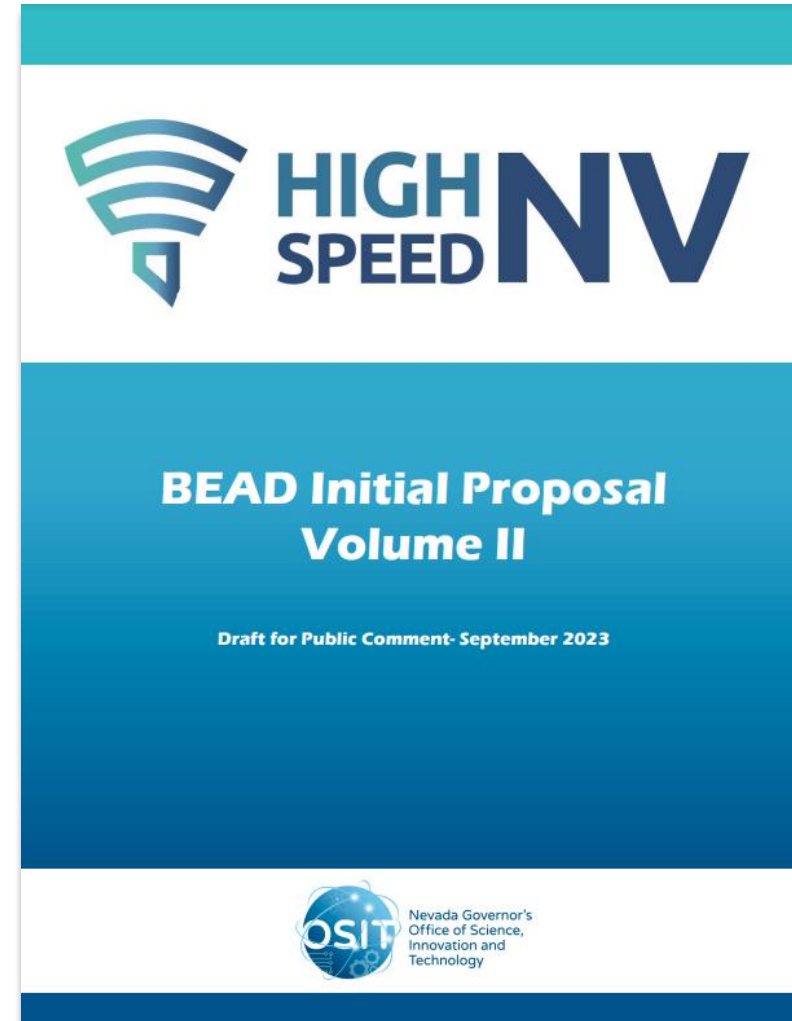

# Regional Project Areas



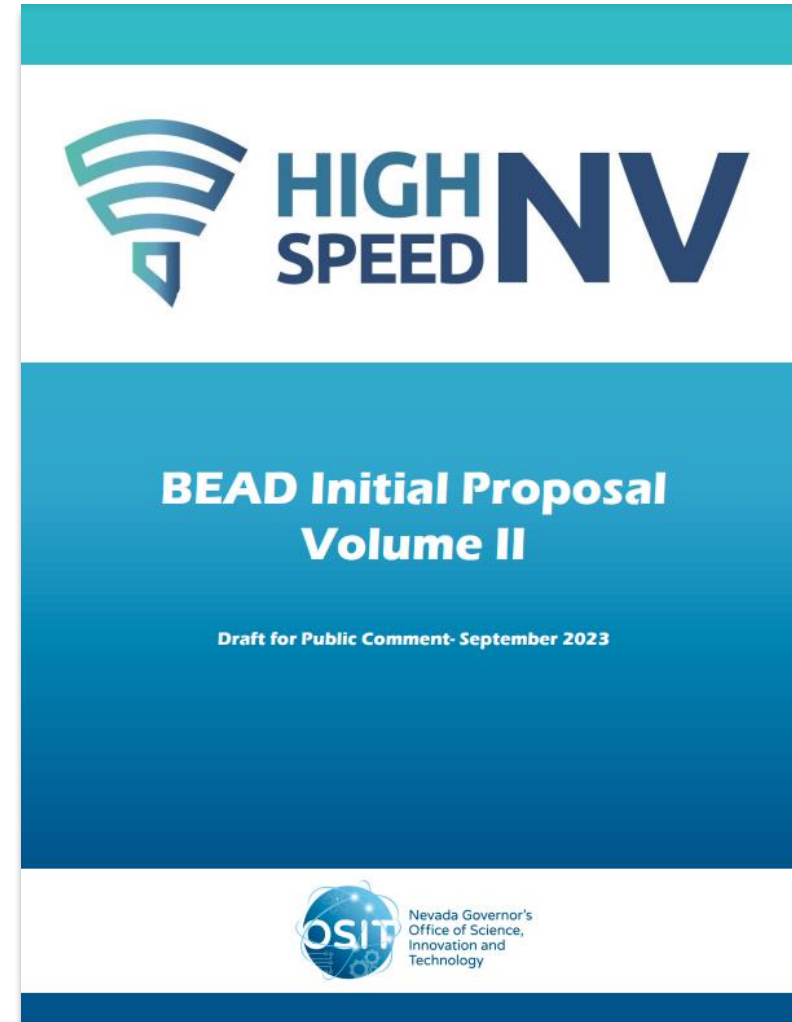
# WHAT IS REFERENCE PRICING?

- ❑ See section 2.4.2.2 of Nevada's Initial Proposal Volume II
- ❑ OSIT will provide three numbers for each RPA
  - ❑ The estimated total cost to serve every location in the RPA (Reference Price)
  - ❑ A Target BEAD Subsidy dollar amount (Subsidy)
  - ❑ A Target BEAD Subsidy percentage (Subsidy/Reference Price)



# HOW DOES REFERENCE PRICING RELATE TO APPLICATION SCORING?

- ❑ See sections 2.4.2.1 and 2.4.2.2 of Nevada's Initial Proposal Volume II
- ❑ Purpose: used to score Minimal BEAD Outlay.
- ❑ It is not required to agree with OSIT's reference pricing. The Subsidy amount does not Represent the maximum or minimum OSIT would allow to serve an RPA.
- ❑ Applicants must provide a total dollar cost to serve every BSL in the RPA and the BEAD subsidy dollar amount they require to do so, from 0% of the total dollar cost to 100% of the total dollar cost.
- ❑ Applicants' total dollar cost may be higher or lower than the reference price.
