


TELEPHONE EXCHANGE AND PROVIDER OF LAST RESORT AREAS

Telecommunications Farm Bill Broadband Program – FY17 - Did You Know?

- * Loan Amounts between \$100,000 & \$20 Million.
- * Unserved areas: "Broadband Service", the rate used to determine if an area is eligible for funding, shall mean the minimum rate of data transmission of 25 megabits downstream and 3 megabits upstream for both mobile and fixed service.

Applicant Priority: The greatest proportion of unserved households.

* Broadband Lending Speed: Applicants must propose to offer new broadband service at a minimum bandwidth of 25 megabits downstream and 3 megabits upstream for both mobile and fixed service to the customer.

Special Terms and Conditions may apply if more than 50% of the households are unserved:

- up to 4 year principal deferral
- 25% extension to the amortization period of the loan up to 35 years

Standard Loan Terms include:

- 2 Year Principal Deferral
- Interest Rate at the Cost-Of-Money
- Loan Maturity Life of the Facilities Financed Plus 3 Years

For All Telecommunications Loan Programs – Did You Know?

Modified Loan Terms for Serving a Substantially Underserved Trust Area (SUTA) include:

- At the discretion of Administrator, RUS can modify certain loan terms or application requirements, which may include:
 - Interest rates as low as 2%, extended amortization period, and/or priority processing
 - Waiver of certain documentation requirements regarding non-duplication of service;
 - Waiver of matching funds or credit support requirements for loans;
 - Extension of the time period in which loans are repaid; and
 - Providing the highest priority for funding to eligible projects that will serve trust areas.

Example Infrastructure Loans financed using SUTA:

- FY 2015 -- Mescalero Apache Telecommunications (NM) \$5.4 million
- FY 2016 -- Sacred Wind Communications (NM) \$13.8 million

Eligible Projects

To be eligible for a Community Connect grant, the Project must:

- Serve a Proposed Funded Service Area (PFSA) in which Broadband Service (4 X 1) does not exist;
- Offer service at the Broadband Grant Speed (10 X 1) to all residents and business customers within the PFSA;
- Offer free service at the Broadband Grant Speed to all Critical Community Facilities (CCF) located within the PFSA for at least 2 years starting from the time service becomes available to each CCF. Critical Community Facilities means the Community Center; any public school, public education center, public library, public medical clinic, public hospital, community college, public university; or law enforcement, fire or ambulance station in the Proposed Funded Service Area.
- Provide a Community Center with at least two Computer Access Points and wireless access at the Broadband Grant Speed, free of all charges to users for at least 2 years and is open and accessible to area residents before, during and after normal working hours and on Saturday and/or Sunday.

Eligible PFSA

Proposed Funded Service Area (PFSA) means the contiguous geographic area within an eligible Rural Area in which the applicant proposes to provide service at the Broadband Grant Speed

Rural Area means any area, as confirmed by the latest decennial census of the Bureau of the Census, which is not located within:

- a city, town, or incorporated area that has a population greater than 20,000 inhabitants; or
- An urbanized area contiguous and adjacent to a city or town that has a population of greater than 50,000 inhabitants. For purposes of the definition of rural area, an urbanized area means a densely populated territory as defined by the US Census Bureau.

Eligible PFSA (Continued)

Broadband Service (4 X 1) cannot exist in any portion of an eligible PFSA.

Applicants should use all available resources to determine if Broadband Service exists, including:

- The NTIA and FCC National Broadband Map http://broadbandmap.gov
- A listing of communities served by existing RUS borrowers and grantees (Telcos and ISPs)
- https://broadbandsearch.sc.egov.usda.gov/searchtabs.aspx
- View service provider websites and contact local service providers

A PFSA must not overlap with the Service Areas of current RUS borrowers and grantees.

Eligible Grant Purposes

- 1) The construction, acquisition, or leasing of facilities used to deploy service at the Broadband Grant Speed to all residents and businesses in the PFSA
 - Buildings constructed with grant funds must reside on property owned by the awardee.
 - Leasing costs will only be covered through the advance of funds period included in the award documents.

Eligible Grant Purposes (Continued)

- 2) The improvement, expansion, construction, or acquisition of a Community Center and provision of Computer Access Points.
 - Grant funds for the Community Center are limited to the lesser of ten percent of the requested grant amount or \$150,000.
 - If the community center is constructed with grant funds, the center must reside on property owned by the awardee.
 - Includes funding for at least 2 and up to 10 computer access points to be used in the Community Center.
- 3) The costs of providing the necessary bandwidth for service free of charge to the CCFs for 2 years.

Ineligible Grant Purposes

1) Funds may not be used to finance the duplication of any existing Broadband Service provided by other entities.

2) Operating expenses are ineligible with the exception of lease costs for facilities used to deploy broadband service and bandwidth expenses.

Matching Contribution

- Applicants must provide a Matching Contribution which is at least 15% of the total amount of financial assistance being requested.
- Matching Contributions cannot include any financial assistance from federal sources unless there is a federal statutory exception.
- At the time of closing of the award, the awardee must contribute or demonstrate available cash reserves in an account(s) of the awardee equal to at least 15% of the grant.
- The Matching Contribution must be in the form of cash, to be used to fund operations of the project.

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Categories of eligible grant purposes

There are three categories of eligible grant purposes:

- 1. Acquiring, by lease or purchase eligible equipment. If leased, the cost of the lease during the three year life of the grant is eligible.
- 2. Acquiring instructional programming that is a capital asset (including the purchase or lease of instructional programming already on the market).
- 3. Providing technical assistance and instruction for using eligible equipment. The costs for this category cannot exceed 10% of the grant amount requested or 10% of the eligible matching funds calculated separately.

New for 2017

Of the funds made available, \$1,600,000 will be prioritized to provide for communication upgrades between ambulances, emergency transportation vehicles and medical facilities.

Eligible Equipment

The following are examples of eligible equipment.

- Computer hardware and software
- Audio and video equipment
- Computer network components
- Telecommunications terminal equipment
- Data terminal equipment
- Interactive audio/video equipment
- Inside wiring

The application must demonstrate both that the predominant purpose (50% or more of use) of every line-item in the grant and match budget meets the DLT Grant definition of distance learning and/or telemedicine.

All equipment must be new and non-depreciated

Ineligible Equipment

Select Ineligible purposes:

- Acquiring, installing, or constructing telecommunications transmission facilities
- To pay for medical equipment not having telemedicine as its essential function; including Electronic Medical Records.
- Medical equipment not used primarily for telemedicine (50%+)
- Salaries or administrative expenses
- Application preparation costs
- Purchase of land, buildings, building construction, site development, or destruction or alteration of buildings.

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
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
