Funding Status - FY 2019

USAC released Wave 27 for FY 2019 on Thursday, October 3rd. Funding totaled \$32.5 million including \$259.2 thousand for Nevada. Cumulative commitments through October 3rd are \$1.80 billion including \$7.3 million for Nevada.

October 31 Proposed deadline to update the business type for existing Form 498s. (See our newsletter of August 19th.)

FCC Seeks Comments on Improving Form 470 Drop-down Menus:

Responding to several years of applicant confusion concerning the drop-down menu options used in Form 470s to properly describe desired product and service options, the FCC issued a request for comments for improving the Form 470 options (DA-986). Assuming changes are to be made, the FCC's goal is to have an improved Form 470 available by July 1, 2020, for applicant use in FY 2021. In doing so, the FCC set out four key criteria.

- 1. The drop-down menu choices should be intuitive and easy-to-understand by applicants.
- 2. The choices should be technology neutral (e.g., covering a variety of fiber and non-fiber "transport mediums").
- 3. The choices should "facilitate compliance with the rules" (e.g., applicants seeking dark fiber bids also need to seek leased lit fiber).
- 4. Applicant postings should be easily searchable by vendors for the services they provide.

As a starting point for revising the Category 1 menu choices, the FCC provides the following proposal for replacing the existing FY 2019/2020 options with a somewhat simpler list:

Leased Lit Fiber (with or without Internet access)

- Internet Access and Transport Bundled (Non-Fiber)
- Transport Only No ISP Service Included (Non-Fiber)
- Internet Access: ISP Service Only (No Transport Circuit Included)
- Leased Dark Fiber and Leased Lit Fiber
- Self-Provisioned Network (Applicant Owned and Operated Network) and Services Provided Over Third-Party Networks
- Network Equipment
- Maintenance & Operations
- Cellular Data Plan/Air Card Service
- Other

FY2021 and Future Funding Years Potential Drop-Down Menu Options

- Transport Service with Internet Access
- Internet Access Only (No Transport Service Included)
- Transport Service Only
- · Leased Dark Fiber and Leased Lit Fiber
- Self-Provisioned Network (Applicant Owned and Operated Network) and Services Provided Over Third-Party Networks
- Category One Network Equipment
- Category One Maintenance & Operations
- Cellular Data Plan/Air Card Service

These changes, if implemented, would clarify the differences between requests for Internet only, transport only, and bundled Internet and transport — regardless of whether such services were fiber or non-fiber based.

Proposed Category 2 menu changes simply add the phrase "& Necessary Software" to many of the Internal Connections equipment types. The FCC also suggests a guided flow chart approach to help applicants navigate through the Category 1 or Category 2 menus. Although not stated, we

presume that the guided approach that might ultimately — unlikely in time for FY 2021 usage — be incorporated within the EPC Form 470 creation process.

The deadline for submitting initial FCC comments on improving the Form 470 drop-down menus is October 31st; the reply comment deadline is November 15th.

Coincident with the release of the Form 470 Public Notice, the FCC issued instructions to USAC (DA 19-985) not to deny FY 2019 applications for bundled Internet services from applicants who had mistakenly selected "Internet Access: ISP Service Only (No Transport Circuit Included)" on their associated Form 470s. This action is similar to the guidance provided by the FCC last year to deal with Category 1 menu errors¹ — and may be required again next year as the result of ongoing confusion with the same Form 470 format in use for FY 2020.

FCC Decision Watch:

The FCC also issued another set of "streamlined" precedent-based decisions (<u>DA 19-942</u>) on September 30th. Applicants facing similar problems as addressed in these decisions may garner useful information by carefully reading the additional FCC explanations found in the footnotes. The original appeal and waiver requests can be found online in the FCC's <u>Search for Filings</u> under Docket 02-6.

In last week's streamlined decisions, the FCC:

1. Dismissed:

- a. Three Requests for Waiver deemed moot as a result of subsequent actions taken by USAC.
- b. One Request for Waiver for failure to comply with the Commission's basic filing requirements.
- c. Eight Petitions for Reconsideration already fully considered and rejected.
- d. Two Petitions for Reconsideration filed beyond the 30-day deadline set for reconsideration requests.

2. Granted:

- a. One Request for Review giving additional time to respond to USAC's request for information.
- b. One Request for Waiver of the application window for a Form 471 filed within 14 days of the deadline.
- c. Seven Requests for Review for late-filed Form 486s.
- d. Five Requests for Review and/or Waiver for Form 471 changes, SPIN changes, or contract date corrections involving ministerial and/or clerical errors.

It should be noted that last year's FCC instructions to USAC also provided relief for applicants who requested "Internet Access and Transport Bundled" (defined for Form 470 purposes as a non-fiber service) but who subsequently selected fiber-based Internet services. This type of service mismatch is not explicitly covered in this year's FCC instructions.

- e. One Request for Review and/or Waiver affirming support of Category 2 equipment purchased on or before April 1 before the start of the funding year.
- f. Two Requests for Waiver of late-filed waiver requests.

3. Denied:

- a. One Request for Review and/or Waiver regarding the failure to satisfy the Red Light Rule.
- b. Eighteen Requests for Waiver seeking invoice deadline extensions.
- c. Four Requests for Waiver for late-filed Form 471s.
- d. One Request for Review for a Form 471 change deemed not a ministerial and/or clerical error.
- e. Eight Requests for Waiver of late-filed appeals or waivers.

USAC News Brief Dated October 4 – Form 470 Drop-down Options

<u>USAC's Schools and Libraries News Brief of October 4, 2019</u>, includes a short mention of (a) the recent FCC guidance to USAC on treatment of FY 2019 applications for which applicants mistakenly selected the wrong Category 1 drop-down menu option on their Form 470; and (b), the FCC's Public Notice seeking comment for improving Form 470 drop-down options in future years. We discuss both FCC actions in greater detail in an article above.
