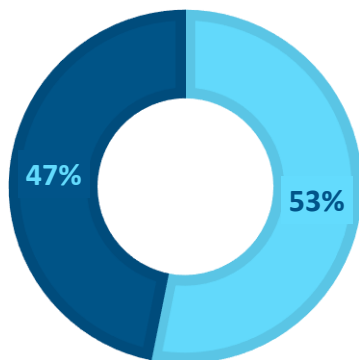

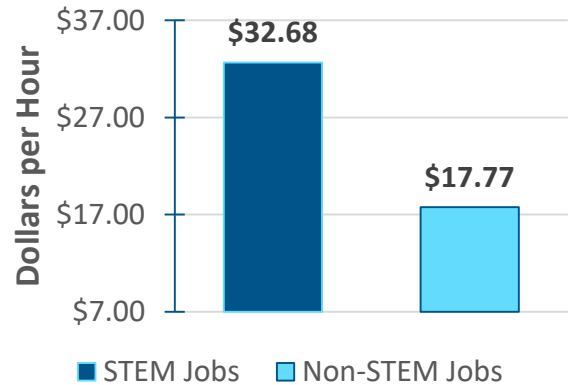
LEVEL OF EDUCATION REQUIRED FOR STEM JOBS

HOURLY WAGE COMPARISON



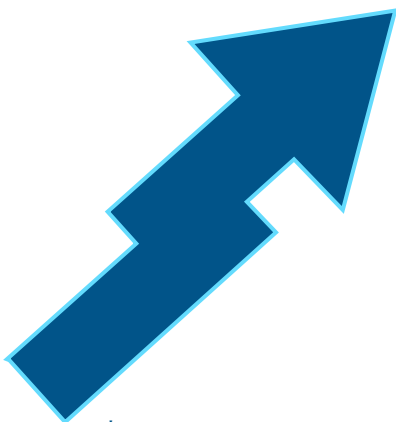

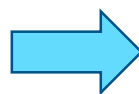

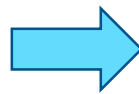


Growth Rate Comparison*



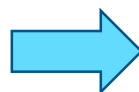

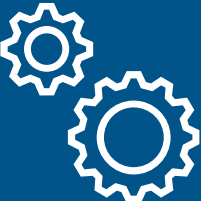

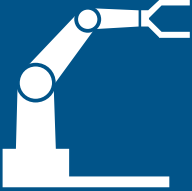
